- ▶ An association of foundations, corporate contributions programs and other grantmaking organizations.
- ▶ Ohio has more than 3,000 foundations that contributed more than **\$1 billion** last year to improve the quality of life for citizens throughout the state.
- ▶ Ohio ranks 7th in the number of foundations; 9th in total giving.

- ▶ *With the Best of Intentions: How Philanthropy is Reshaping K-12 Education*
- ▶ 2005 report, *Buckets in the Sea*, by researcher Jay Greene
- ▶ Philanthropy gave between \$1 to \$1.5 billion to K-12 education in 2002...Less than 1% of total education spending

- ▶ Help members make strategic, aligned investments that will have the greatest positive impact on Ohio's students/schools.

Education Initiatives' Highlights

- Released *Education for Ohio's Future ...* OGF's education reform agenda [DECEMBER 2006]
- Convened a statewide conference on Ohio's education reform priorities [MAY 2007]
- Conducted 10 regional conversations where 1,500 Ohioans talked about the implications of state education reform for their students and schools [AUGUST 2007 – JANUARY 2008]

EDUCATION FOR OHIO'S FUTURE



Education Initiative's Highlights

- Convened two workgroups composed of representatives of 33 stakeholder organizations to explore ways to prepare Ohio students for 21st century success [MAY 2008]
- Advanced 11 consensus policy recommendations in ***Beyond Tinkering ...*** the product of the two workgroups [JANUARY – MAY 2009]
- 75% of consensus recommendations included in the budget bill, House Bill 1 [JULY 2009]
- Hosted 6 regional meetings to discuss national and state education reform activities, along with local education needs [OCTOBER – DECEMBER 2009]

Race to the Top (RTTT)

- Secured collaboration and involvement of key education stakeholder groups in proposal development and review (including Ohio's legislative leaders)
- Developed materials and mechanisms for broad-based communication efforts
- Helped prepare RTTT presentation materials and prepped the "pitch team"
- Hired national RTTT consultant to help provide strategic direction and advice to the Project Team
- The Result...Assisted in securing \$400 million for Ohio's schoolchildren

- ▶ Broker and convene education reform-related discussions
 - ▶ Host regional meetings
 - ▶ Assist OGF members in meetings in their communities
